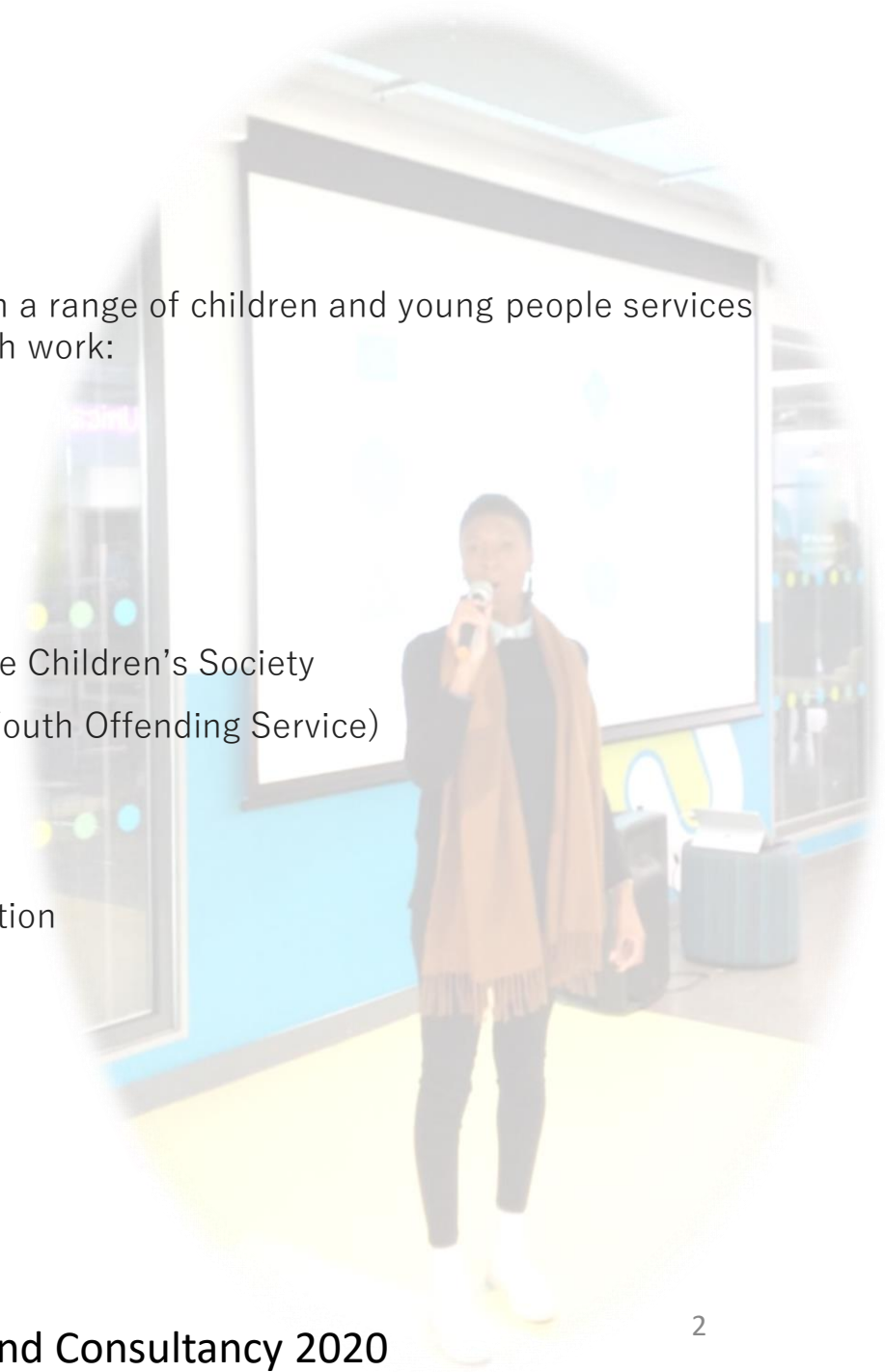

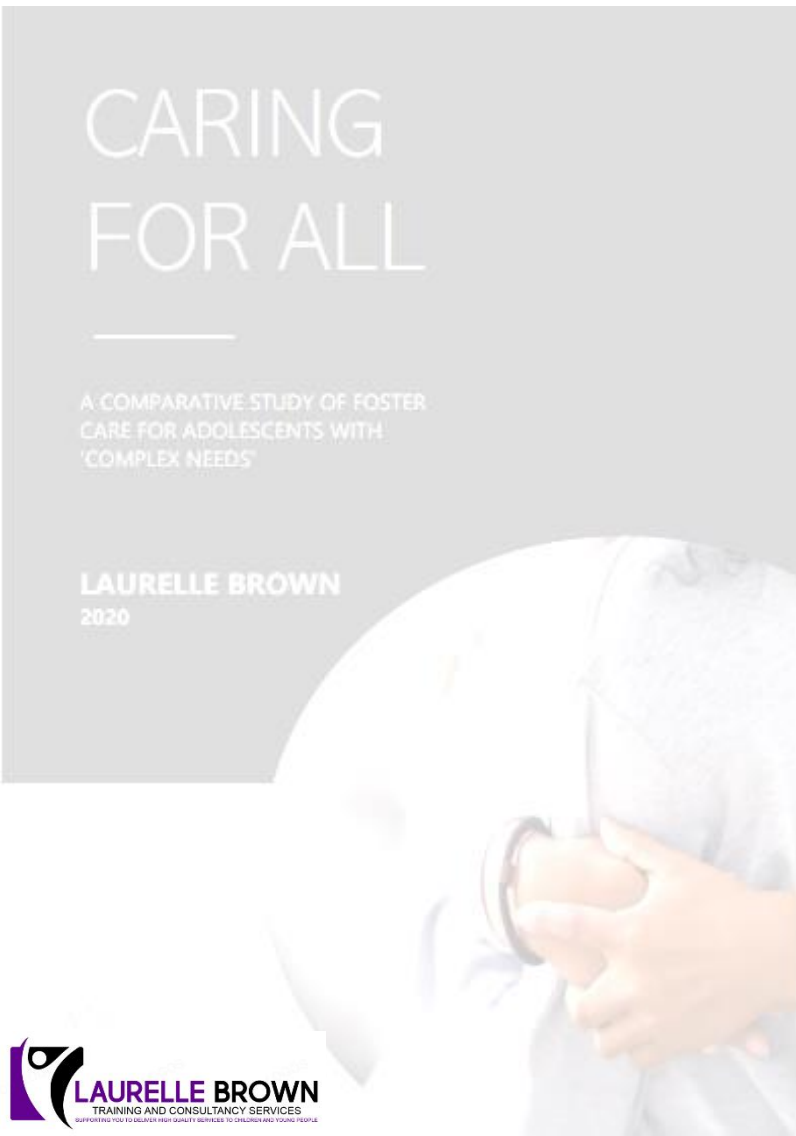
Laurelle is an active community member, who enjoys giving back through volunteering, advocating and other activities.
